The 15 new educators will commence their Prairie Project journey with an intensive workshop in June. The workshop will include engaging sessions to support the educators in designing their classroom lessons, as well as presentations from leading experts in the areas of prescribed fire, mixed-species grazing, pyric herbivory, and learning theory. The workshop will conclude with tours of collaborating ranches in Texas and Oklahoma.

Educators from cohorts 1 and 2 continue to implement projects in their classrooms to engage students and foster rangeland literacy. This past year, the educators also presented their projects at various professional conferences, including The Annual Meeting of the Society for Range Management, NSTA's National Conference on Science Teaching, and the Annual Meeting of the Ecological Society of America.

Educator Spotlight

Dr. William Quinn



Dr. William Quinn is a faculty member at St. Edward's University in Austin, Texas. He encourages students to learn science by doing science, and he was faced with a challenge in 2020 to transfer his field course to an online format.

About:

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As part of The Prairie Project, Dr. Quinn introduced his senior-level undergraduate students to the practice of pyric herbivory through a variety of virtual assignments. Students watched engaging videos and built their own quadrat plots. Students also virtually developed point and other sampling techniques and applied image analyses of pictures from OSU's Klemme Research Station. Dr. Quinn assessed his students through written paper assignments, an oral presentation, and exam questions. Despite the challenges of teaching practical concepts online, Dr. Quinn's students recognized his innovative teaching methods and appreciated the engaging and diverse learning experiences.

Future plans:

Dr. Quinn plans to present his work with The Prairie Project at the 2022 Annual Meeting of the Ecological Society of America.

Rangeland Ecologist, Dirac Twidwell, studies woody plant encroachment and is working to conserve the last remaining grasslands in the Great Plains. His lab explores new technologies using geospatial analyses to see the change in vegetation and increase awareness of this problem.

He has mentored over 20 graduate students and post-docs since joining the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 2014 and 5 post-docs have accepted faculty or lead government scientist positions in the last 2-3 years.
